

The twenty-fourth annual Pacific Grove Concours Auto Rally, which has raised more than \$300,000 for youth programs on the Monterey Peninsula, will be held on Friday, August 24, 2018. Each year the event takes place on Friday of the Concours d'Elegance weekend at Pebble Beach and the Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion at Laguna Seca.

The Pacific Grove Concours Auto Rally is geared for people who own and drive their own classic and vintage cars. The rally draws 200+ participants and 5,000 spectators line the rally route.

This year's event marks the organizational transition from Pacific Grove Youth Action to Pacific Grove Rotary.

The Pacific Grove Concours Auto Rally was started in 1995 as a fund raiser in support of the Pacific Grove Youth Center and other youth programs. Pacific Grove Rotary joined PG Youth Action nine years ago as a 50% partner for the rally organization. PG Rotary has provided volunteers and board member support.



BMW of Monterey

"Classics of BMW Automotive History" by David Laws

Founded in Munich, Bavaria, as an aircraft engine manufacturer in 1916, Bayerische Motoren Werke (BMW) has also produced farm equipment, household items, and motorcycles as well as automobiles. The vehicles below represent important milestones in the company's rise to a leading manufacturer of premium automobiles.



1929 - BMW Dixi 3/15

The first automobile, a licensed copy of the British Austin 7, was introduced in 1928 as the BMW 3/15. German improvements included four-wheel brakes, a more spacious body, and a higher quality interior.

1952 - BMW 501

The first post-war vehicle, the 501, a large luxury car introduced in 1952, was not a commercial success but re-established BMW's status as a manufacturer of high-quality, technically-exciting cars.



1961 - BMW 1500

"New Class" 4-door sedans, beginning with the 1500 in 1961, restored BMW to financial health after a near brush with bankruptcy. The New Class expanded in the mid-1960s to include the iconic BMW 02 Series.



The 1975 3-Series cemented BMW's reputation for quick, sporty-handling cars with powerful engines, and remains its best-selling and most versatile design through five generations of vehicles.

Thrilling Automobile Races Delight Crowds at Del Monte by Gregory Berkin



The very first west coast-organized automobile club races took place in Monterey, California in August 1903. The drivers competed on an "ordinary, elliptical, single mile track" under the banner of the DEL MONTE RACETRACK built behind the Hotel del Monte, then known as "the most elegant hotel in the world" that today serves as the Naval Postgraduate School. A

hill-climbing segment of the contest was decided up Carmel Hill on the road to Pacific Grove.

Over eleven hundred society spectators gathered at the site to witness Pacific Coast history. Official speed and distance records were set, making it "the biggest and most successful automobile race ever held in Western America."

George Whittell, Jr., the winning driver of the French 'Mors' 24hp racer (whose car costs a mere \$12,000 in 1903), broke a West Coast racing record of 1 min and 15 sec per mile at an average speed of a numbing 48 mph.

These competitive 'enthusiast' races for gasoline and steam cars pre-empted the soon-to-be-famous New York/Long Island Vanderbilt Cup Races of 1904, the French Grand Prix at Le Mans, the UK's Brooklands of 1906, and the Indianapolis 500 races of 1911.

The DEL MONTE AUTO CLUB MEET of 1903 was contested as a challenge cup race, in which the Automobile Clubs of California (Northern vs. Southern) offered a trophy to the winner of the race.

Twelve racing entrant vehicles originated from eight different manufacturers. Competing were Mors, Peerless, Pope, Rambler, Stevens Duryea, Waltham,

> White, and Winton. Drivers were Andrews, Arnold, Ellb, Fuller, Garbutt, Grothe, Hewston, Hotaling, Keenan, Keller, Kellogg, Luckhardt, Saunders and Whittell.

As described in the San Francisco Chronicle: "The air reverberated with strange noises, like the bubbling of many city fire engines

at night. There was the "putty-putty" breathing

of the smaller racers, the bigger "choo-choo" of the heavy machines, the loud explosive cough of the Mors French wonder which won the Paris-Vienna race of last year and the intermittent, pistol-like report from air blasts, while all the spectators greeted the swiftly passing racers with a wild discord of duck-quacking choruses from their automobile alarms horns."






WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Pacific Grove has supported the youth of our community through sponsorship of the annual PG High School track meet, held continuously since 1968; the annual donation of dictionaries to each 3rd grader in Pacific Grove elementary schools; and providing annual college scholarships to four PGHS seniors; and the proceeds of our Pacific Grove Auto Rally held for the last 23 years during Concours week have gone to numerous youth programs in our city; and

WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Pacific Grove has brought funding into our community through Rotary District grants, including recent projects such as signage for the pollination garden at the Pacific Grove Natural History Museum and support for necessities for homeless women served by the Gathering for Women; and

WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Pacific Grove has worked with Rotary Clubs around the world to eradicate polio; has contributed to earthquake and fire relief efforts; and has supported Rotary Youth Exchange programs to help train the leaders of tomorrow to be active builders of a more peaceful world; and

WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Pacific Grove now celebrates its long history of making positive, lasting change in communities at home and abroad; and

WHEREAS, the city of Pacific Grove recognizes and honors the many Rotary Club service projects benefitting our community over the past 70 years, I recognize the Rotary Club of Pacific Grove for all of their philanthropic endeavors geared toward making our community a better place to live and work; and

Therefore, I, Bill Kampe, Mayor of the City of Pacific Grove, do hereby proclaim June 19, 2018 as Rotary Day in Pacific Grove, and encourage all citizens to join me in extending gratitude and congratulations on behalf of the City to the Rotary Club of Pacific Grove on its birthday.

- Organizing the Rotary Invitational Track Meet at Pacific Grove High School since 1968.

- Building the Little House in Jewell Park (and 50 years later rebuilding it to meet ADA standards).
- Restoring the Gazebo in Jewell Park.

- Funding Sea Otter and Whale statues in Berwick Park, and signage at the Museum of Natural History.
- Donating manpower and funding to convert the auditorium at the Middle School into the Pacific Grove Performing Arts Center as a community show place.

PACIFIC GROVE WALKING TOUR



123 Forest Avenue AMERICAN FOURSQUARE

American foursquare presents a two-story boxy shape with a hip roof, heavy eaves, a porch across the front, and plain ornamentation.



110 Forest Avenue PUEBLO REVIVAL

These earth colored buildings feature flat roofs, low parapet walls above the roofs, projecting wood bearns, and rounded windows. The attempt was to capture the appearance of the adobe structures of the Southwest.



110 17th Street

VICTORIAN BEACH COTTAGE Homes often shared similarities with other Victorian buildings, particularly in the use of wood ornamentation around the porches and gable ends.



133 17th Street

FOLK VICTORIAN

Cottages often shared similarities with other Victorian buildings, particularly in the use of wood ornamentation around porches and gable ends.



588 Central Avenue

"KIT HOUSE"

Inside out homes were ready-to-assemble and sold through mail order companies such as Sears, Roebuck & Co. They arrived by train and were brought to the site by wagon. Noticeable fastening bolts can be seen on the corners.



137 16th Street

GOTHIC

Homes feature steep roofs with projecting stick work, irregular composition, lancet windows, trefoil and quatrefoil porch trim, and board and batten siding.



129 Pacific Street

GOTHIC REVIVAL

Also called Carpenter Gothic, this style originated in England in a revolt against the rigidity of classical forms. Homes feature irregular composition, steep gable roofs, trimmed porches and board and batten siding.



139 19th Street

VERNACULAR

Vernacular applies to traditional American architecture built with a combination of memory of eastern forms, local needs and traditions, and availability of materials. Elements consist of double hung sash windows and wood siding.



649 Lighthouse Avenue

QUEEN ANNE

Homes display a variety of decorated porches and eaves, gables, towers and turrets, bay windows, stained glass, and patterned shingles. Structures vary greatly in size and design.



BOARD AND BATTEN

This design is typified by wide vertical wood siding with the vertical joints covered by much narrower wood boards called battens,



574 Lighthouse Avenue ROMANESQUE

Features include simulated sandstone block siding and brick construction of unreinforced masonry. Entryway columns are often a feature of this style. This building is the best example on the Monterey Peninsula.



541 - 553 Lighthouse Avenue VICTORIAN COMMERCIAL


Victorian commercial storefronts feature bay windows, ornamentation, and the use of a variety of colorful paint.




165 Forest Avenue SPANISH/MEDITERRANEAN REVIVAL

Features are whitewashed stucco, low pitched tile roofs, arched openings, balconies, and wrought iron window grills.
